COMMANDER'S COMMENTS

As I write (late January), Post's year-end activities are winding down, interior Holiday decorations

are stowed away, and the beautiful lighted garlands and ribbons decorating the front of our Post will soon come down. One might think we are slipping into the mid-winter doldrums (or "blahs") at Post 28, but our Calendar (see last page) shows this is not the case, for we have much to "fill our sails" and keep our spirits up. We will have our 12th Annual Chili Cook-Off (Saturday, the 9th) and our Annual SAL Hawaiian Luau (Saturday, the 23rd), with good food and live music on both occasions. And we have our friendly bar staff and volunteer kitchen crews providing us Wednesday Legion Dinners (except February 27th) and Friday Burger Nights to provide us a warm place with good food, libations and company to help beat off those Winter Blahs. So, come on down and join us!

Plus, we have another exciting major event to keep us busy, one of the largest Post improvement projects we have undertaken in many years. As most of you are aware if you have attended recent Post meetings and briefings, at our January meeting,

pursuant to the unanimous recommendation of the Executive Committee, our Veteran Members unanimously approved going forward with the second phase of our Post Improvement Project (PIP). The PIP was borne out of a Strategic Planning initiative, including a Post membership survey, designed to identify major needs or issues facing the Post in the foreseeable future. The survey findings focused primarily on key issues related to the physical structure and functioning of the Post's main floor. Phase I of the Project, completed last month, included implementation of new security measures, including installation of a 24-hr video-surveillance system. Phase II will focus on making major improvements in the lounge, dining and main entrance areas. In addition to periodic reports at Post meetings (starting last August), in January, to help further ensure member understanding and support of the PIP and the actions required, (1) a floor plan for the upgraded main entrances, lounge and dining areas was displayed at the Post, and (2) formal and informal briefings were given by the Post Improvement Team to all interested Veteran, Auxiliary and SAL members.

To ease professional contractor work and availability of bar services during Phase II, volunteer members have already begun work in preparation for the arrival of the contractors. Members wishing to volunteer their help should contact Darrel (see notice in this issue). The contractors will start work on Monday, February 25th and continue through early April. During this period, dining services, including Legion Dinners and Burger Nights, will be necessarily suspended. Bar services and a temporary

lounge area will be available in the veranda on the second floor. All large meetings will be held in the adjacent Post Meeting Room. Access to the second floor will be via the elevator or the back stairway. The Main (northeast) entrance and stairway will be closed. We regret any inconveniences, but everything is being done to help ensure we have a smooth and safe completion of the project with as little disruption as possible to Post activities. It will be worth it for, in the end, we will have a welcoming, new, enlarged, more efficiently served and safer lounge/dining environment for all of us to enjoy for many years to come. Thanks to all of our members and patrons for making this possible, and especially to the Post Improvement Team (Darrel Myers, Andy VanderHoek, Dave MacKellar, Bill Kaufman), the Strategic Planning team (Phil Slater, Rev. Dan Anderson, Tina Davis, Mike Ripka, Ron Bauer), and the members of the Executive Committee, whose input and efforts have made getting this major effort underway possible. Going forward, we will appreciate your understanding, cooperation, support, plus any assistance you may give, to help us accomplish this important project.
