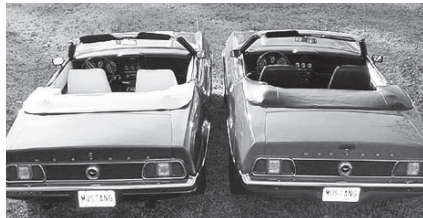
COMMANDERS COMMENTS

The SAL purchased a AED Defibrillator for the Post. The AED is a portable electronic device that automatically diagnoses the potentially life threatening cardiac arrhythmias of ventricular fibrillation and ventricular tachycardia in a patient and is able to treat them through defibrillation. The application of electrical therapy which stops the arrhythmias, allowing the heart to reestablish an effective rhythm. With simple audio and visual commands, AED are designed to be simple to use. We will be training on its use in the near future,
